Structure

Question words come at the end of the sentence. For example, “what’s your name?” will be “you name what” in Thai. In a statement, the word order is similar to English language structure: Subject + Verb + Object.

First Conversation

A: Hi.

B: Hi. How are you?

A: I'm fine. My name is.....What is your name?

B: My name is I come from.....Where do you come from?

A: I come from A: Where do you work?

B: I work at.....What about you?

A: I work atSee you later. Nice to meet you.

B: Same here.
